



CAPRI Training Session 2016

5th – 8th September 2016, UCD (Dublin, Ireland)

Aims of the Training Session

The current Training Session is organized under the umbrella of the TRUSTEE project - <http://www.trustee-project.eu> and aims at:

- Learning to analyse how changes in agricultural policies affect agrifood markets, farming decisions and the environment.
- Improving knowledge about agricultural economics and quantitative modelling of agriculture.
- Learning how to work with result sets from the CAPRI model and its Graphical User Interface (GUI).
- Discussing issues of common interest for CAPRI contributors and users (i.e. model development and maintenance).

Organisation of the Training Session

The Training Session will start on Monday 5th afternoon with a pre-session for CAPRI beginners, focusing on the basic structure of CAPRI, an introduction to the Graphical User Interface (GUI) and the CAPRI installation on laptops. From Tuesday 6th to Thursday 8th September, the sessions will concentrate on using existing result sets from scenario analysis based on CAPRI. Participants will work in small groups (3-6) supervised by a trainer.

Laptop needed

Participants should whenever possible bring along a Laptop with about 1.5 Gigabyte of free space and should have access to an administrator account if [TortoiseSVN](#) as well as an updated [Java Run Time Engine](#) (32bit or 64bit) are not yet installed.

Please note in Ireland we use the same 3 point plug system that they use in the UK, which means that everyone attending apart from those coming from the UK should bring a convertor with them. This website may be useful

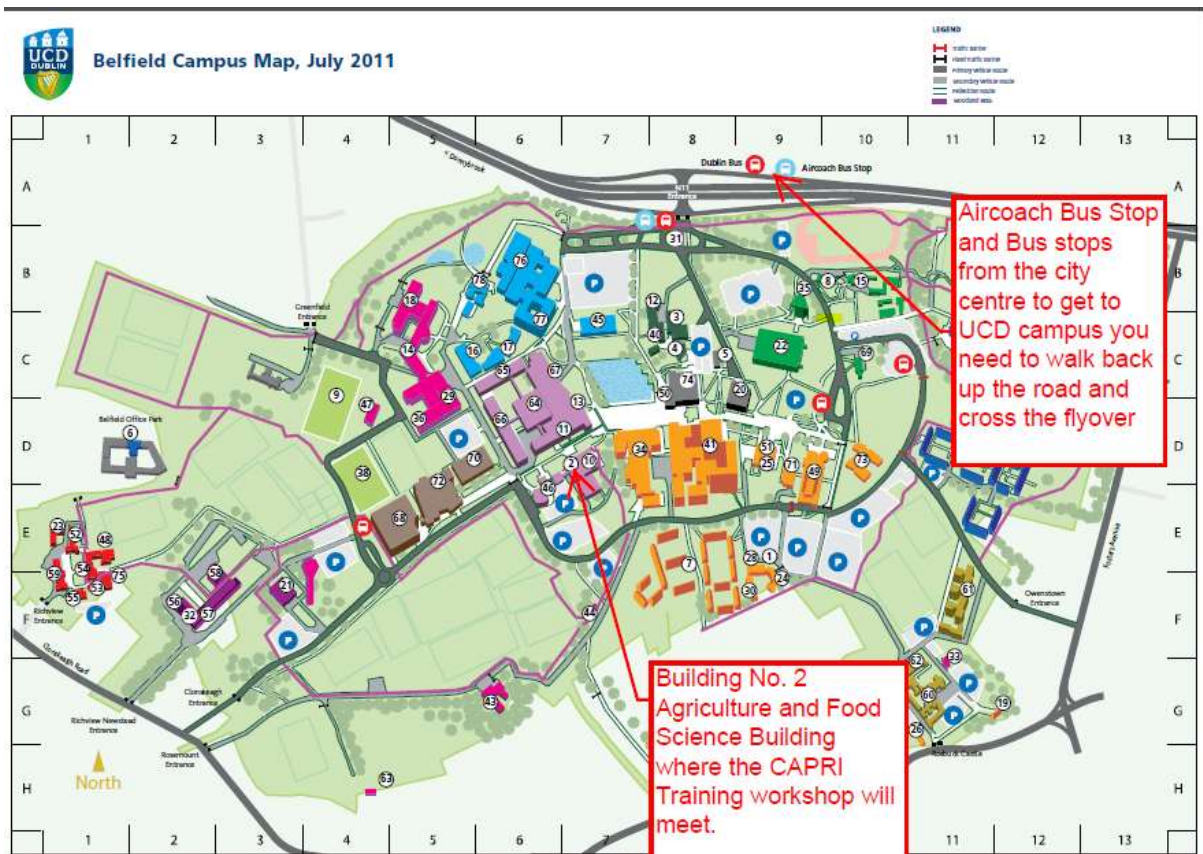

How to get to Dublin

Travelling by plain

All international flights arriving in Dublin arrive at Dublin airport which is located on the Northside of the city.

Logistics

The CAPRI workshop will take place from the 5th to the 8th of September in UCD.

To get from Dublin airport to the city centre or UCD, you can :

-Take the **Aircoach**: the Aircoach will depart the airport every 15 minutes and will take you to the city centre in about 20 minutes and to UCD in around 30 to 45 minutes. You can prebook your ticket online for 9 euros or buy it from the driver on the day for 10 euros.

All Aircoach services operate from the front door of both Terminal 1 and Terminal 2 at Dublin Airport. The Aircoach also stops at or close to a number of the hotels on the list below.

Terminal 1: The stop is located at the front door on the Arrivals road at Terminal 1. On exiting the baggage reclaim area turn left and turn left immediately as you exit the terminal building.

Terminal 2: The stop is located on the Departures Road at Terminal 2. On exiting the baggage reclaim area please continue along the same level following the signs for buses and coaches, cross the footbridge, and then exit down the escalator on the left hand side.

-By **taxi**: UCD is 18km from the airport so it would take you around 20 to 30 mn to get there and cost between 25 to 30 euros

Accommodation

Please note that we have not blocked hotel rooms for the attendants. Therefore we strongly recommend that you book the accommodation early to take advantage of discounts; cancellation is often free (i.e. via www.booking.com). Below you will find some accommodation options located near the city centre and those closer to the UCD campus.
